As artists we will...

 ...study different techniques of painting and drawing (including layering, acrylic painting, silhouettes, watercolour painting and line work using ink pens) to create our own version of the New York City skyline

As mathematicians we will...

- …solve problems involving the calculation of percentages
- ✓ …recall and use equivalences between FDP
- ...solve problems involving measure

- …use ratio and proportion to solve problems
- …deepen our knowledge on properties of shapes
- …describe position and direction mathematically

As musicians we will...

 ...study the pop song 'Happy' by Pharrell Williams as part of the Charanga scheme. This will allow us to develop singing using our knowledge of dimensions of music (pulse, rhythm, pitch etc.) as well as recorder skill

In D&T we will...

 ✓ …find out about and prepare classic American favourite foods as well as the many, varied cultural influences that make American cuisine special

As geographers we will...

- ...study North America by looking at its countries, climates, features, capital cities and time zones
- ...produce a non-chronological report about the USA as part of an in-depth country study
- …focusing on the Great Plains and how the geographical features make it a hard place in which to settle

As historians we will...

- …use sources of evidence to understand how bias and prejudice can affect our views
- ✓ …track the events between the Cowboys and Indians and how their lives changed because of these
- \checkmark ...understand how and why conflict arose between the two sides

As scientists we will...

- …describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics
- ...give reasons for classifying plants and animals based on specific characteristics
- …identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways
- ✓ …recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things
- ✓ …recognise that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents
