Impact of Sport Grant spending

- Higher % children attending out of school clubs.
- Wider variety of sporting activities available in PE lessons and after school.
- More involvement of staff and higher % of children in a wider variety of competitive sports (inclusive)
- Teachers accessed PE CPD and coaching from PE specialist
- Junior Playleaders trained up to support dinnertime activities
- Children across KS2 involved in games activities at dinnertime with L2 TA
- School gained the Sainsbury's Games Gold Mark at end of year-
