As you know, our school policy, concerning children wearing earrings, has been that small studs can be worn although they must be taken out by the child for PE lessons or be taken out at home on the day of the lesson. However, last week we had two occasions where children's ears were hurt because their earrings were caught on something not in PE lessons. These were small stud earrings. As children are now having more physical exercise at school, as well as playing together at playtimes and dinnertimes, for safety reasons, we ask that your children do not wear earrings at school. This will save children worrying about taking them out and also losing them. If you are having your child's ears pierced, we ask you to do this at the beginning of the 6 weeks holiday to give the ears time to heal. PE is a compulsory part of the curriculum and we don't allow earrings to be taped over because this is not safe either. Please remember to remove earrings at the beginning of the school day. The only jewellery children may wear is a watch. Necklaces and bracelets are not allowed either. This also applies to our youngest children in our nursery as their curriculum is split between indoor and outdoor play, which includes lots of climbing and jumping activities.

Nail varnish on nails and false nails are also not part of our children's uniform policy.
