Phonics	Watch Mrs Enwright read the story of Owl Babies on tapestry.	Learn the song 5 wise owls, uploaded onto tapestry. Can you sing it to your grown up	Can you make a story map with your grown up, recalling the story of Owl babies and adults to draw simple pictures ie – 3 baby owls, different owls on different trees, owls cuddled together, Owl mummy returning. Encourage your child to make marks to join in too, can they choose the correct colours? Can they recall the characters? Can they recall the language used by Bill “I want my Mummy” etc.	Recall the story again to your grown up. Who were the characters? Where did they live? Why were they worried? Did their Mummy come back? How did they feel? Explain that you are going to clap out the syllables in the words from the story, we have been practising this in class. Mum–my (two claps – one per syllable) Bill (one clap) Per-cy (2 claps) Branch (1 clap) Tree (1 clap)	Watch Mrs Stockdale’s video on tapestry. Can you go on a sound walk?
Maths	Can you go into your garden or when out walking and find 3 different sized branches or sticks, for the three owl babies to sit on?	Adult to show pictures of owls to look at. Then count how many eyes, wings, talons (feet) and nose (beaks) they have.	After reading the story, The Owl Babies. Use positional language to describe mummy owls' journey. Up, down, high, over, next to, behind, on, under.	Draw the characters in the story by size. Huge, Big, Medium, and Small.	Look at the owl pictures. look at the feathers on the different owls and draw the patterns you can see on the Feathers. The Library will have owl books to borrow or you could use the internet to research.
Creative	Can you go outside and find lots of collage materials like leaves and twigs and design your own owl like the one below? 	Can you practise singing the 5 Wise owls song from our phonics lesson?	Can you watch Mrs Enwright’s video of how to draw an owl (don’t judge her drawing...she’s no Picasso ha hCan you draw your own owl?	The baby owls feel scared and worried in the story. When we are worried, we often feel like we have butterflies in our tummies. Do you ever feel like that? Can you tell your grown up why? Adults can you offer solutions ie – Child is worried about leaving you to come to school. Explain that school is a fun place where they can play with new friends and toys and that you always come back for them, and then you can have fun together.	Can you use materials in your house like cotton wool, paper, crayons etc to make your own owl mask?
